

THE MILL OF BENHOLM WELCOMES YOU

The Mill of Dephalm is a restored water-newored historic mill in a heautiful and peaceful setting

Developments with North East Scotland Preservation Trust and the Asset Transfer from Aberdeenshire Council

We had hoped that more progress would have been made regarding the asset transfer between the Council and NESPT, but things are moving in the right direction.

Over the last 3 months we have had several meetings with NESPT, Sarah Kettles, who is the Development Officer dealing with the fundraising application process for the Mill of Benholm and representatives from ARC Architects and Community Enterprise. ARC are the architects responsible for the condition report of the Mill of Benholm and Community Enterprise are assisting with the revised Business Plan for the Mill of Benholm.

The final versions of the condition report and the business plan are being completed and checked by the Quantity Surveyor. This will enable NESPT to submit their application for the asset transfer from Aberdeenshire Council together with the legal framework and the supporting brief from the development officer, in the first quarter of 2023.







Furthermore, a funding application to cover the costs of a Conservation Plan has been submitted to the Architectural Heritage Fund for decision in February 2023. This will help to inform future funding applications and is a requirement of some.

To meet the requirements of Aberdeenshire Council for the asset transfer, several expressions of interest have been submitted to funders to cover the costs of Phase 1 in the Business Plan. As soon as Aberdeenshire Council has given their legally binding agreement for the asset transfer, these expressions of interest will be changed into funding applications.

During Phase 1 we will stop further deterioration of the Mill of Benholm, making it safe and accessible for the public once again.

2023 will be an exciting year for the Mill of Benholm!

Mill Brae Wood


After a successful meeting with Brotherton Estate's owner, Mill of Benholm Enterprise have started to work on a lease for Mill Brae Wood which lies across the Burn of Benholm. We would like to reintegrate the wood with the Mill of Benholm site creating a linked network of paths and work to restore the biodiversity of this important habitat. Work has already been done to remove the dead elm trees and the site is abundant with ash, willow and birch regeneration. More planting of native species will take place once the new layout has been established.





Historic Churches Scotland

To improve the accessibility to locals and visitors of the whole of Benholm's unique natural and built heritage, we are working with Historic Churches Scotland, the owners of the historic Benholm Kirk. Together we are looking into the possibility of re-establishing and old and long forgotten path connecting the Mill of Benholm with Benholm Kirk alongside the Castle Burn.



Both organisations are working hard together to promote Benholm and its surroundings, with its array of A listed buildings, core paths and incredible biodiversity.

On the 11th of December we held our first joint fundraising event with Historic Churches Scotland, an 'Afternoon of Carols' in Benholm Kirk.

This proved to be a great success, especially as we were joined by the pupils, of the Johnshaven Primary School.






In January we will work on an events calendar for 2023, some will be in Benholm Kirk, but hopefully, some will be at the Mill of Benholm.
